

Punta Gorda Police Department to Host Community Presentation & Discussion

The Punta Gorda Police Department has partnered with the NAACP to bring the training course *The Cost of Bias and its Impact on Policing/Community* to our officers. This training will be conducted by Dr. David Thomas, a professor at Florida Gulf Coast University and renowned author of *The State of American Policing: Ethics, Implicit Bias, and Credibility*.

As part of this process Dr. Thomas will be conducting a community presentation and discussion prior to the officer training in order to answer questions community members have regarding why officers use force, officer and agency accountability, biased policing, internal affairs complaints, and police/minority relations and how these issues relate to

the Punta Gorda Police Department and our community.

The community presentation and discussion will be held at the Charlotte Harbor Event & Conference Center on Wednesday, September 9, 2020 from 6:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. Due to social distancing requirements seating will be limited, the event will be open only to Charlotte County residents, and advanced tickets are required for admission.
